The Child's Welfare

Working Together

Parents are encouraged to communicate respectfully, use parenting plans and resolve issues without unnecessary conflict.

Mediation

Family mediation may help parents reach practical agreements before court proceedings are considered.

When Court May Be Necessary

If agreement cannot be reached or there are safeguarding concerns, an application to the Family Court may be appropriate.

Preparing for Meetings

Keep a record of important events, school information, medical needs and proposals for future arrangements.
